The above written and signed by myself now residing at No 33 Rue de Cognac Paris August 13 - 1827. John Ashley Sturt. A mortgage made by Monsieur Gilbert Agent de Change amounting to 3000 fr. was 5% is the property of my brother this standing in my name this I effected in order to avoid the expense of a second power of Attorney. In the Court of Chancery in the County of Middlesex and John Gray Esquire of Devonshire in the County of Devonshire and John Gray Esquire of Devonshire in the County of Devonshire were being sworn to depose the truth of the facts that they knew and were well acquainted with John Ashley Sturt late of Bruges in Flanders and of Rue Cognac in the City of Paris Esquire and Colonel in His Majesty's Forces deceased who departed this life on the twenty ninth day of December last and also with the manner and character of handwriting and subscription having frequently seen him write and subscribe his name to writings wherever they have come to know and be well acquainted with the manner and character of handwriting and subscription and the documents containing now with care and attention viewed and perused the paper writing thereunto annexed purporting to be and contain the last will and testament with a memorandum thereto written at the foot thereof the said will beginning thus "I John Ashley Sturt" ending thus "August 13. 1827" and subscribed "John Ashley Sturt" the said memorandum beginning thus "Transfer ending "Power of Attorney" and subscribed "John Ashley Sturt" they these deponents depose that they so verily believe the whole body words and contents of the said will as also the memorandum thereto and the subscription to be all of the proper handwriting and subscription of the said John Ashley Sturt the testator deceased and of none other. On the 23rd June 1828 Adminon with the will annexed of the goods chattels & credits of John Ashley Sturt late of the City of Bruges in Flanders & of Rue Cognac in the City of Paris in the Kingdom of France Esq & Lieut Col: in His Majesty's Forces deceased was granted to Elizabeth Sturt widow the sole & universal legatee named in the said will having been first sworn duly to administer the Executor is

This is the last Will and Testament of me a Jasper Swindall of Bishopgate Street without the City of London Grocer first on condition of my wife first paying to Mrs Collett eighty four pounds and procuring a satisfactory discharge from her of all demands for my Executors & then give unto my said wife Sarah Swindall all my household furniture & plate and on the same condition I give her the six shares which I hold in the Revd Mr Fleetwood's Chapel then I leave unto Joseph Barrow & Saml Darton both of Bishopgate Street London Grocers the residue of my effects of every kind & whatsoever & whatsoever in trust for the following purposes first for the payment of my just debts & for my interment and if my Executors have to pay the above mentioned sum of eighty four pounds to Mrs Collett I then leave my said six & sixpence shares to form part of this residue and out of part of my furniture as may be sufficient to satisfy Mrs Collett's demand & in that case the remainder only to my wife Mrs Swindall of the said furniture then the produce of my life policy & its accumulations being £500 I leave to be divided among my six children as they respectively arrive at the age of twenty one in
